
Explanation

- It evolved during the Cold War as a mechanism for monitoring the Soviet Union and sharing classified intelligence.
- It is often described as the world's most successful intelligence alliance.
- India is not a member of this alliance
- The Five Eyes (FVEY) is an intelligence alliance comprising Australia, Canada, New Zealand, the United Kingdom, and the United States.

• These countries are parties to the multilateral UKUSA Agreement, a treaty for cooperation in signals intelligence,

Explanation

- Dhanush is the first indigenous long-range artillery gun developed by Ordnance Factory Board (OFB) and manufactured by the Gun Carriage Factory.
- The gun is a 155 mm45 calibre gun with a maximum range of 36.5 km and the capability of automatic alignment and positioning.
- It is equipped with inertial navigationbased sighting system, auto-laying facility, onboard ballistic computation and an advanced day and night direct firing system.
- Statement 2 is incorrect: India is signing a deal with UAE for acquiring 93,895 Close Quarter Battle (CQB) carbines.
- They are miniaturized assault rifles featuring an overall shorter barrel and is comparatively lighter in weight and easier to handle compared to Assault Rifle.
- Statement 3 is correct: INS Vikrant is the first aircraft carrier designed and built in India.
- It has over 76 percent of the material and equipment which is indigenous.

- The ship is 262m long, It has over 2,300 compartments designed for a crew of around 1700 people including specialised cabins to accommodate women officers.
- The ship is equipped with numerous highend technologies, including network-centric distributed data processing and control systems and state-of-the-art weapons such as the Barak LRSAM (long-range surface-toair missile) and sensors.
- Statement 4 is correct: Pinaka Multi Barrel Rocket Launcher is the upgraded version of the Pinaka which has been in service with the Indian Army for the last decade.
- The system is jointly designed by laboratories of Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) Armament Research & Development Establishment (ARDE), Pune and High Energy Materials Research Laboratory (HEMRL), Pune.

About Paracel Islands

- This **tropical archipelago**, about onethird of the way from central Vietnam to the northern Philippines.
- It is composed of <u>130 small coral</u> <u>islands and reefs</u> divided into the northeast Amphitrite Group and the western Crescent Group.
- It is surrounded by **productive fishing grounds** and by potential oil and gas reserves.
- In 1932, <u>French Indo-China annexed</u> <u>the islands</u> and set up a weather station on Pattle Island.
- Maintenance was continued by its successor, <u>Vietnam.</u>
- <u>China has occupied the Paracel</u> <u>Islands since 1974</u>, when its troops seized a South Vietnamese garrison occupying the western islands.
- The islands are *claimed by Vietnam and Taiwan*.

Background of Dispute

• Beijing says that references to the Paracel Islands as a part of China sovereign territory can be *found in 14th*

century writings from the Song Dynasty.

- Vietnam on the other hand, says that historical texts from at least the 15th century show that the islands were a part of its territory.
- These islands also find mention in records starting from the 16th century by <u>explorers who led expeditions to</u> <u>the East</u>.
- The <u>Portuguese, British, Dutch, French</u> <u>and Spanish</u>, have all written about the Paracel Islands in various texts.
- <u>Colonial powers of the French-Indo</u> <u>China</u> further accelerated the tensions with regard to the Paracel Islands due to their colonial policies in the 20th century.
- By 1954, *tensions had dramatically increased* between China and Vietnam over the archipelago.
- In January 1974, <u>China and Vietnam</u> <u>fought over their territorial</u> disputes after which China took over control of the islands.
- In retaliation, in 1982, Vietnam said it had extended its administrative powers over these islands.
- In 1999, Taiwan jumped into the fray laying its claim over the entire archipelago.

Present Context

- Since 2012, <u>China, Taiwan and</u> <u>Vietnam</u> have attempted to reinforce their claims on the territory.
- By engaging in *construction* of government administrative buildings, *tourism, land reclamation initiatives*.
- And By establishing and <u>expanding</u> <u>military presence</u> on the archipelago
