

2. Elaborate the efforts made by Durkheim  
for the acceptance of sociology as a  
legitimate science. How far do you think,  
he succeeded in his endeavours (10)

Durkheim is recognized as  
the first sociologist to have attempted  
a truly empirical analysis, on the  
lines of the sciences, in his study  
of suicide.

Efforts made by him  
(for the acceptance of sociology as a  
legitimate science).

① His idea of social fact → as  
external to and coercive to the  
actor, having some objective  
manifestation. e.g. = Marriage –  
appropriate age, Norms and values.

② Study of suicide → use of

empirical analysis (of suicide rates) and  
multivariate analysis in his 'Le  
Suicide'.

- ③ Study of Religion → as something  
eminently social, stemming from  
collective effervescence.
- ④ Study of Division of labour on an  
evolutionary scale.

Whether he succeeded or not

### Successes

- 1) Suicide study-  
rates of suicide  
based on variables  
of religion, region,  
etc.
- 2) Social fact -  
a great tool to  
objectively study society.

### Failures/ Criticisms

- 1) Study of suicide -  
data inadequate  
(unreported / attempted  
suicide)
- 2) Ecological Fallacy -  
generalizing to society  
Something individualistic

widened the sociological parlance and  
definitely succeeded, at least in establishing  
methodological ways of science.

Weber and Marx extensively  
studied the Interplay of Religion  
and Capitalism. But their Ideas  
were inherently opposite. It is often  
said that Weber's Theory is Marx  
Theory turned upside down.

Weber

Structures

Spirit of Capitalism', Weber  
expresses that

beliefs stem from  
Economic Infrastructure.  
In Capitalism, since  
the labourers/Workers  
are exploited and  
both Proletariat  
and Bourgeoisie are

(Class in itself),  
Marx calls Religion  
'OPIUM of Man'.

4. What are ~~the~~ unanticipated consequences?  
How are they different from latent  
functions? Explain using examples. (10)

Unanticipated consequences  
refer to those situations / results  
which occur without a deliberate  
or intentional effort towards that  
end.

Eg - Use of Fertilizer subsidy.

Intended consequence = make agriculture  
easy and economic.

Unintended consequence = Overuse / Misuse of  
fertilizer =>  
✓ Environmental pollution  
✓ Food Insecurity  
✓ Anti microbial Resistance etc

They are different from latent functions.

Latent functions — functions of a social system which exist, but which are not manifestly visible to everyone, but have to be established by a Social Investigation.

Eg = Family as an 'Institution'.

{ manifest functions = economic unit  
Social security etc.  
Latent functions = Socialization  
( Parsons = Families are industries producing Human personalities )

Unanticipated consequence and latent functions therefore differ in a parallel manner of the nature of 'discover' Invention' and 'Discovery', respectively.



phenomenon. However, it is far from true.

- 1) Head does not negate the possibility of creation of Causal-functional theories.
