What is a Secular Separation between religious & political institutions.

Committed to principles and goals derived from non-religious

sources.

What is Secularism?

Opposes all forms of inter-religious domination.

Opposes intrareligious domination.

Mainstream/ Western Secularism

Mutual exclusion between State and Religion The state
cannot aid
any religious
institution nor
hinder their
activities.

Little scope for community based rights. **Indian** Model of Secularism

Equal focus on focus on focus on intra-religious and inter-religious domination.

Deals with religious freedom of individuals as well as communities.

Compatible with the idea of state-supported religious reform.


